WHAT WE BELIEVE ABOUT MINISTRY IN THE CHURCH

What We Believe about MINISTRY

- Salvation in Jesus Christ automatically includes a call to ministry. Every believer is created, saved, called, gifted, authorized, and commanded to minister.
- Ministry is the heart of the Christian life (Matthew 20:28).
- Function follows form in ministry. How God made me determines what he intends for me to do. God has uniquely shaped each individual for a specific ministry.
- God has given all his children gifts that can be developed and used in ministry.
 Everyone is a "10" in some area and has something to offer. Developing and using your gifts is an act of good stewardship and service.
- You discover your gifts through ministry instead of discovering your ministry by identifying your gifts.
- The evidence of the right match between my SHAPE and my ministry is fruitfulness and fulfillment.
- Membership and spiritual growth are prerequisites to ministry. Therefore, we require CLASS attendance and commitment to these two areas before serving through MOORE'S CHAPEL.

What We Believe about THE BODY OF CHRIST

- God intends for ministry to be performed through the context of the local church.
 Membership includes a commitment to ministry.
- The Holy Spirit has provided our church body with all the spiritually gifted people needed to do everything he wants done. Our task as a church is to discover, enlist, train, and support these people in ministry.
- The church is a family, not a business; an organism, not an organization. Therefore, we streamline the structure in order to maximize ministry and minimize maintenance. We do not bury ministries under procedures.
- The mobilization of every member as a minister is the key to balanced growth of the church.
- The greater good of the whole body must always take priority over the needs of any single ministry. There is no place for "turfism" in God's family.

What We Believe about **THE ROLE OF PASTORS**

- The equipping of the members for ministry is the number one priority of the pastoral staff. The people are the ministers and the pastors are the administrators (Ephesians 4:11–12).
- The objective of the Ministry Team is to mobilize and equip an army of ministers who are maximizing their unique Spiritual gifts, Heart, Abilities, Personality, and Experiences (SHAPE) in a meaningful place of service through our church.
- Every member deserves personal assistance in discovering a meaningful place of ministry. We value the individual more than the ministry. At MOORE'S CHAPEL, we call them SHAPE Discovery Sessions.
- Those involved in ministry are entitled to competent leadership from the staff. Therefore, every ministry is assigned a staff supervisor who is committed to the success of that ministry.
- Each staff supervisor is to provide training, encouragement, guidance, feedback, and resources to the ministers under his or her care.
- The church is to operate on the basis of spiritual gifts rather than elected office. We do not elect people to ministries.

What We Believe about TRAINING

- Every minister is a learner. The moment you stop learning, you stop leading.
- We emphasize on-the-job training more than pre-service training. We learn best by doing. We delegate to develop people.

What We Believe about **PERFORMANCE**

- We expect excellence in ministry, not perfection. Excellence is doing your best.
 God deserves our best.
- We encourage creativity and innovation in ministry, which assumes mistakes will be made. "No mistakes" means you're not growing or trying anything new. We have no failures in ministry at MOORE'S CHAPEL —just failed experiments.
- A failed project does not mean a failed person. There are no "wrong" people in ministry—just "right" people in the wrong ministry.

What We Believe about **ACCOUNTABILITY**

- We become what we are committed to. Therefore we encourage growth in commitment to Christ and his church.
- Everything rises or falls on leadership. No ministry can exceed the commitment of those leading it.
- One mark of a maturing church is that standards for leadership are raised every year.
- There must be periodic reviews of all ministries. We do what is inspected, not just expected. Sometimes best intentions are not enough.

What We Believe about **DIVERSITY OF MINISTRY**

- We have unity without uniformity. We believe diversity in ministries simply illustrates the unique giftedness of individuals.
- Any member who has completed Class 301 may submit a new ministry idea application to the Ministry Team.
- Every ministry must fulfill one or more of the basic purposes of the church.
- Ministries have life-cycles. If a ministry isn't meeting a need anymore, we will give
 it a decent burial. There are no sacred cows!
- Most ministries require a one-year commitment, but we allow people to change ministries gracefully, without guilt. We don't lock people in permanently.
- Only official ministries of MOORE'S CHAPEL, under staff supervision, are given publicity space in the bulletin, on the patio, or on the website.
- Your primary ministry commitment should be in the area where you are best shaped. Your secondary ministry includes serving in any other area of the body where you are needed.
- You are not ready for ministry until you are willing to serve anywhere.

Gifts are not to be confused with natural abilities.

Gifts are not to be confused with the fruit of the Spirit.

But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, forbearance, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness and self-control. Against such things there is no law.

Gifts are not to be confused with Christian roles.

Be aware of the "Gift Projection" tendency.

The gift projection tendency is expecting others to serve the way I do and have similar results.

Our gifts do not make us superior to others.

The eye can never say to the hand, "I don't need you." The head can't say to the feet, "I don't need you."

DISCOVERING YOUR ABILITIES

Your abilities are the natural talents with which you were born. All of our abilities come from God. The Bible says, "God has given each of us the ability to do certain things well" (Romans 12:6, NLT). Since your natural abilities are from God, they are just as important as your spiritual gifts. The only difference is that you were given them at birth.

There are different abilities to perform service.

1 CORINTHIANS 12:6 (GNT)

"I [God] . . . have filled him with . . . skill, ability and knowledge in all kinds of crafts."

EXODUS 31:3 (NIV84)

One of the most common reasons people give for not getting involved in ministry is, "I just don't have any abilities to offer." Nothing could be further from the truth. The key is matching your abilities with the right ministry!

Six Misconceptions about Your Abilities

1. MYTH: Most people only have a few abilities.

The truth is that most people possess between five hundred and seven hundred specific skills!

2. MYTH: People aren't born with skills. All skills must be learned through experience.

This simply is not true. There are a number of talents, which seem to be inborn, or are developed very early in infancy. When people say, "He just seems to have a natural talent for it," it's probably true!

3. MYTH: You will be very aware of the abilities you possess.

Again, this is not true. You are probably using a number of talents or skills of which you are not even aware! You need some process of skill identification.

4. MYTH: You must have natural talent to develop skills.

The truth is we can learn to do a number of things well without possessing natural talent. Need or desire motivates most of our learning.

5. MYTH: Skills, which must be learned, are learned primarily in the classroom.

Actually, some of your most basic skills were learned at home, "on the street," or somewhere else outside the classroom.

6. MYTH: Skills that I use at work are only usable in that environment. I can't use them in ministry.

We hope by the end of this class, you'll see the fallacy of this idea. Be creative!


Congratulations! You have now completed Classes 101, 201, and 301! The 301 process involves four steps:

TEN TRUTHS ABOUT SPIRITUAL GIFTS

- 1. Only **BELIEVERS** have spiritual gifts.
- 2. Every Christian has at least **ONE SPIRITUAL** gift.
- 3. No one receives <u>ALL OF</u> the gifts.
- 4. No single gift is given to **EVERYONE**.
- 5. You can't **EARN** a spiritual gift.
- 6. The HOLY SPIRIT decides what gifts I get.
- 7. The gifts I'm given are <u>PERMANENT</u>.
- 8. I am to <u>DEVELOP</u> the gifts that God gives me.
- 9. It's a sin to <u>WASTE</u> the gifts God gives me.
- 10. Using my gifts **HONORS** God and **EXPANDS** me.

GIFTS ARE NOT TO BE CONFUSED WITH CHRISTIAN ROLES

Recognize that you have a <u>PRIMARY</u> and a <u>SECONDARY</u> ministry in your church.

- 1. My <u>PRIMARY MINISTRY</u> commitment should be in the area where I am <u>GIFTED</u> (or <u>SHAPED</u>).
- 2. My <u>SECONDARY MINISTRY</u> commitment includes serving in any other area of the body where I am <u>NEEDED</u>.

DISCOVERING YOUR HEART

My heart is the <u>REAL</u> me!

MY HEART DETERMINES...

- 1. Why I <u>SAY</u> the things I do.
- 2. Why I <u>FEEL</u> the way I do.
- 3. Why I <u>ACT</u> the way I do.

You can do God's will and serve God's purpose by letting your heartbeat <u>MOTIVATE</u> you for ministry.
